Now visa-free for the better part of the world, and increasingly accessible by air travel, the magnificent city of Kyiv, so close to the geographical center of the continent, is still something of a novelty for European tourists. A mere couple of hours' flight from most major cities in Europe, it is an ancient beauty of a town, its history dating back over 1,500 years, its parks and green zones routinely ranked among Europe's most abundant, and its hundreds of restaurants so affordable that the average delicious meal rarely exceeds the 10 Euro mark. Speckled with over 150 beautiful churches and temples, some of which are on the UNESCO World Heritage List, Kyiv boasts an arresting blend of medieval, baroque, constructivist, and modernist buildings. Those less captivated by history and architecture are sure to be won over by Kyiv's highly original bars serving craft cocktails and by night clubs hosting legendary underground raves, justifying the city's reputation as "the new Berlin."

For a perfect romantic getaway, take a leisurely stroll across one of Kyiv's lovely parks (you'll need at least a week to see them all!), or book a boat trip along the Dnipro, or have a nice picnic on the vast river's bank. A 15-minute walk from the downtown area can bring you straight to the beach anytime you feel you need some R & R.

Kyiv prides itself on being a perfect tourist destination and vacation spot. There are two airports in the city, as well as a marina and a railway network that connects it to the rest of Europe. Plenty of five-star hotels, mostly international chains, can be found in the city. Other accommodation options include reasonably-priced boutique hotels and apartments for rent right in the city's beating heart. In addition to theatres, museums, galleries, and malls, Kyiv is brimming with beaches and wooded areas, its parks accounting for more than half of its square mileage.

HALLMARKS OF THE REVOLUTION OF DIGNITY

VOLODYMYRSKA HIRKA (VOLODYMYR'S HILL) PARK

In his novel The White Guard. known in the world Kyivan writer Mikhail Bulgakov calls Volodymyr's Hill "the best place in the world," no less - an opinion shared by photographers, artists, locals and tourists, who one and all enjoy the astounding city vistas that open up here.

On Sep 28, 1853, the newly-built park hosted the official unveiling of a monument to Prince Volodymyr, who at the end of the 10th century had baptized the local citizenry in the Dnipro river. This being the first monument in Kyiv, the best sculptors and architects of the imperial court were invited to work on the project, although the credit now mostly goes to professor Peter Klodt. Ornamented with a relief commemorating the Baptism of Kyiv, the city emblem, and the Order of St. Volodymyr, the 20-m pedestal was designed by architect Alexander Ton and sculptor Vladimir Demut-Malinovsky.

Later, Volodymyrska Hirka became a popular holiday destination for local residents, its popularity reaching its peak in the 1860s-80s. If the aristocrats walked city parks only in warm weather, lower-class visitors flooded the Volodymyrska Hirka park all year long. Nowadays, it still remains a sentimental favorite for many Kvivans.
